Administrative History

The Symposium "East Meets West" was organized by the Loyola University Chicago History department to commemorate the 400th anniversary of the arrival of Matteo Ricci in China. It was an international symposium with speakers from the United States, Hong Kong, Rome, and Toronto participating. A variety of fields, including History, Religious Studies, Asian Studies, and Art History, were represented.

Held from October 7th through 9th, 1982, the symposium had three main topics: the Jesuit activities in China, Chinese reaction to the missionaries, and the Jesuits as interpreters of China to the West. The keynote speaker was Jonathan Spence from Yale University, who spoke on "Matteo Ricci and the Ascent to Peking". In addition to the presentations, Cudahy Library at Loyola University Chicago had an exhibit of rare books pertaining to the topics under discussion.

Following the symposium the papers presented were published in the book *East Meets West: The Jesuits in China, 1582-1773*, edited by Charles E. Ronan, S.J., and Bonnie Oh.

Scope and Content

The Matteo Ricci Symposium records comprise 1.5 linear feet spanning the years 1954-1989 (bulk 1980-1989) and include correspondence, flyers, articles, invitations, press releases, proposals, address lists, programs, notes, and exhibit text.
