Christine Marshall Kraemer was appointed organist of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Evanston in 2011. She served as interim o/cm at St. Luke's from November 2009 through June 2011.

Christine holds three degrees from Northwestern University's School of Music: DM in Church Music and Organ, MM in Church Music and Organ, and Bachelor of Music Education. Richard Enright and Wolfgang Rubsam were her organ teachers at NU. As a graduate student, she assisted Grigg Fountain, Director of Music and Organist at NU's Alice Millar Chapel.

Christine was a featured organ soloist for Bach Week in Evanston at St. Luke's, beginning in 1975. She played recitals at St. Clement Church in Chicago and NU's Jeanne Vail Chapel in Evanston for WFMT's complete Bach Organ Works marathon series in Fall 2014.

Dr. Kraemer taught Survey of German Organ Literature to graduate students at NU from 1990-2004. Among area churches she has served as organist or organist/choir director are Lincoln Park Presbyterian Church, Kenilworth Union Church, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Northbrook, and First Presbyterian Church of Evanston.
