Christopher Orf has been Director of Music and Liturgy at Saint Michael Catholic Church in Wheaton since the Summer of 2007. A native of Saint Louis, Missouri, he holds a Bachelor of Music in Organ, from Fontbonne University and a Master of Music in Sacred Music and Organ from Lindenwood University. He is a Colleague of the American Guild of Organists and past Sub Dean and Secretary of the Gateway East AGO Chapter and current Dean of the Fox Valley AGO Chapter in the west suburbs of Chicago.
