Steps for using GI Bill

1 Apply for Benefits: ebenefits.va.gov	2 Certificate of Eligibility (COE)	3 Term Enrollment & Certification
⇒ VA determines eligibility & rating ⇒ Dependent/spouse students: Service-member must transfer benefits prior to you applying to use benefits.	⇒ In 4-6 weeks student receives hard copy in the mail ⇒ Scan and submit copy to forms.luc.edu/faupload/login.htm (must have UVID and Password) ⇒ No further steps needed by student	⇒ Two-step certification by MVSS ⇒ Student must complete certification request form.

An agreement between Veteran Affairs and LUC

- ⇒ Dollar for dollar contribution to cover tuition and fees above the annual award
- ⇒ No additional application is needed. MVSS automatically applies to student account
- ⇒ Active duty & spouses of active duty are NOT eligible. COE with separation date required

Monthly Housing Allowance (MHA) Notes

- **Prorated based on eligibility rating**
ie. fulltime student with 80% GI Bill eligibility, may receive 80% E-5 with dependents while attending courses on campus.
- **Student must be enrolled above halftime**
to be eligible to receive an MHA
- **If a student's enrollment is 100% online**
student is eligible for only 50% on the national MHA average.
- **Rate of pursuit (full vs. part time) rounded**
ie. 9 Credits=3/4 time or 75% would receive 80% MHA

FAQs

- **What happens if I have scholarships?** *All tuition-restricted scholarships must be applied to tuition and fees before the GI Bill or Yellow Ribbon are applied.*
- **When is the Yellow Ribbon applied?** *After the GI Bill annual award is exhausted.*
- **Can the GI Bill or Yellow Ribbon be used for housing?** *No. They are only authorized for tuition and mandatory fees.*
- **What are the mandatory fees?** *Please visit luc.edu/Bursar for the current tuition and fees.*
- **What if the eligibility is less than 100%?** *Student is eligible for the given % of the annual award, monthly housing allowance and book/supply stipend.*
- **Will I see the GI Bill or Yellow Ribbon on my award letter?** *No. It will be added during the certification process.*

FAFSA Funding

- Student may qualify for additional non-VA funding.
- Complete a FAFSA: studentaid.gov

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Things to consider

Benefits as time vs money

- Fall/Spring Semester= approximately 4.5 months (17weeks each)
- 36 months of benefits= approximately 8 (4 Fall, 4 Spring) semesters
- Bachelors degree=120 credits/8 semesters= 15 credits hours/semester

Summer Certifications

- Summer terms are accelerated, therefore VA uses credit hour equivalents to determine rate of pursuit (fulltime/halftime/etc.)
- Credits X 18 / length of term in weeks= equivalent credit hours
- 3 credits X 18 / 6 weeks= 9 equivalent credit hours
- Taking a 3-credit hour course during a 6-week summer session is equivalent to 9 credit hours during a traditional Fall or Spring semester
- 9 equivalent credit hours/ 12 credit hours= 3/4 time or 75% rounded up
- Student would receive 80% the MHA

Dorm & Meal Plans

- MHA is paid directly to the student, therefore room/board & meals are student responsibility and due at beginning of semester
- Please visit: luc.edu/bursar/iPlan for payment options

Changes in Enrollment

- Students must notify the MVSS of changes in their enrollment.
- Failure to notify can lead to delayed processing, lost of benefit time or creation of debt

Satisfactory Academic Progress

- SAP requirements must be met in order to be eligible to use their benefits

Initial Certification

- Begins up to 30 days before classes begin
- Only # Credit hours are reported to VA
- Allows VA to begin MHA processing

Secondary Certification

- Occurs after Add/Drop Deadline
- Confirmation of credit hours, tuition and fees reported to VA.
- Allows student to change schedule without adverse impact to benefit
- VA submits payment directly to LUC
